A decade ago, Geoff Kimmerly was a journalist for the Lansing State Journal after receiving a degree from MSU. He didn't have set plans for his next career venture. Now, he is a MHSAA (Michigan High School Athletic Association) member revolutionizing the future of high school sports in terms of popularity, safety, and playability.

One change he aided, is sports eligibility after transferring. Being such a controversial issue this sent waves across the entire state of Michigan

"Our transfer rule this year is completely different," Kimmerly said. "It all depends on the details of a person's current home and the sports they played at [their first school]."

If a person transfers without their guardians residence changing or dealing with divorced parents they aren't eligible to play the sports they did before, in the previous year.

"We do our best to make our sports as fair as possible," Kimmerly said.
